From the Pastor ...



As I write this, Easter Sunday is coming up. It will be our second Sunday back in the freshly painted sanctuary. It's beautiful! But far more wonderful than buildings, nine people will have been baptized on Easter!

Resurrection Sunday is a perfect day to be saved or baptized. Baptism is an outward expression of a lifechanging belief in Jesus's death, burial, and resurrection.

The first Sunday in April we will finish a sermon series called "Believe," based on chapters 11-21 in the Gospel of John.

Martha declared a good but general statement of belief that people will be resurrected on the last day. Jesus pointed her general belief to a personal application: "Whoever lives and believes in me will never die. Do *you* believe this?" (John 11:26).

As you know, Jesus proclaimed the good news about the Kingdom of God, often times supported by some amazing miracles. Shockingly, a few people who saw miracles still would not believe in Jesus (12:37, 39). Pray for people who chose to refuse to believe in spite of seeing evidence of God.

Jesus did mighty things while He walked the earth. He also prophesied about things to come. Why? "So that when it does happen you will believe that I am He (13:19)." What Jesus foretold about his death and resurrection did happen. What He prophesied about the end times is still to come. The Lord tells us ahead of time so we will believe.

One of the things Jesus talked about was how He would prepare rooms in His Father's house, and His followers knew the way. Some of the disciples just didn't get it. Jesus almost pleaded with them, "Believe me when I say that I am in the Father and the Father is in me; or at least believe on the evidence of the miracles themselves (14:11)."

Then in the next chapter, Jesus declared several indicators of a true disciple; things that should be evident in every believer.

- When you believe, the Word cleans you. 15:3
- When you believe, you remain in Jesus. 15:4
- When you believe, you bear fruit. 15:5
- When you believe you <u>love each other</u>. 15:9-12
- When you believe, you obey Jesus. 15:14
- When you believe, you might be <u>hated</u>. 15:18
- When you believe, you testify. 15:26-27

The Holy Spirit helps believers. But, amazingly, He is also here for those who *don't believe*. "When He (the Holy Spirit) comes, He will convict the world of guilt in regard to sin and righteousness and judgment: in regard to sin, because men do not believe in Me (16:8-9)." The Spirit brings people who don't believe to the truth about the Lord, so they will be saved.

Jesus prayed for those who did believe and for those who would believe in the future. "My prayer is not for them alone. I pray also for those who will believe in Me through their message (17:20)." Think about this, Jesus prayed for *you* way back then! We also should pray for future believers and then tell them the message about salvation.

Everybody experiences occasional struggles in their faith journey. Sometimes it can be a crises of belief. In John 18, Judas, Peter, the high priests Annas and Caiaphas, Pontius Pilate, and Barnabas all experienced a fork in the road of their faith. Some responded well, some did not.

John 19 details Jesus' death. Pilate, Joseph of Arimathea, Nicodemus, and the Apostle John all testified about Jesus the Lord, some by their words and others by their actions. John was with Jesus from the beginning of His ministry right through His terrible death on the cross. He wrote, "The man who saw it (John) has given testimony, and his testimony is true. He knows that he tells the truth, and he testifies so that you also may believe (19:35). "When you testify what you know to be true about Jesus, others will believe.

In John 20, Jesus arose from the grave! He appeared to Mary and to the Disciples (except for Thomas who was late for the meeting). A week later, Jesus appeared to them again and Thomas was there. Jesus told him, "Stop doubting and believe (20:27)." Doubt is alright when we work though it to a stronger faith. There often comes a time, however, when the Lord says that it's time to stop doubting and believe.

Peter was fishing when Jesus first called him to become a disciple. He said, "Come, follow me, and I will make you fishers of men (Matthew 4:19)." Then twice in John 21 at the end of His time on earth, Jesus told Peter, "You must follow me(21:19, 22)." More accurately, *continue to follow me*." Salvation is the start of our belief in Jesus. We must keep believing, evidenced by continuing to follow Him and His plan for our lives.

April 14 we begin a new message series: *Hidden Gems*. Deuteronomy 29:29 (CSB) The hidden things belong to the Lord our God, but the revealed things belong

to us and our children forever, so that we may follow all the words of this law.
