We will experiment with a new way of doing church. In addition to our Live on the Lawn Sunday morning service (which will return indoors eventually), we will **record the following Sunday service on Sunday nights, in the Chapel, at 5:30.**

Here's how it works: after you join us in person or online Sunday morning, Oct 25, you are welcome to come again at 5:30 in the Chapel as we record the Nov 1 service. I will preach that same message in person on Nov 1, and then record the Nov 8 message that night. Regular Sunday night 6:30 meetings can still start on time.

Why this way?

- We want to not just maintain but improve our online worship experience. Recording in the Chapel and editing it ahead of time is the first thing we can do.
- We would like for some people to be there so our music and message will have the authenticity of a live audience.

## Operation Christmas Child

Covid might stop some things but not Operation Christmas Child for First Baptist Church. We will take part in this mission opportunity again this year, but with a few extra options to allow your safe Covid practices.

You may **stop by** the church office and pick up the boxes you want to fill. Shop, wearing a mask, pack your box and then mark boy/girl and age. Bring your box back to the church office with a \$9 check (made out to FBC) or \$9 cash for the shipping. Pray for the child receiving your box. You are done.

You may **deliver items** that you want to donate to Operation Christmas Child to the church office anytime between now and Sunday, November 1st. The church will consolidate these items and pack boxes.

You can **donate cash or check** to the church to cover the cost of the shipping fee for the boxes the church will pack.

NEW this year, because of Covid and its restrictions, you can just **donate money** to FBC for Operation Christmas Child. The church will send these funds to Samaritan's Purse allowing them to put the money where Operation Christmas Child needs it. It takes around \$30 to fill and ship one box.
